MINIMIZE BLIND SPOTS USING OUTSIDE MIRRORS

Blind spots are areas alongside your vehicle that you cannot see.

Outside and inside rearview mirrors help drivers to see vehicles, motorcyclists, bicyclists, and pedestrians on either side of and behind the vehicle, but they don't allow drivers to see everything, and blind spots can still exist.

Mirrors can be positioned to maximize visibility.



Driver's Outside Rearview Mirror

Place your head against the driver's side window and adjust the outside rearview mirror so you can just see the left side of your vehicle.



Passenger's Outside Rearview Mirror

Position your head in the middle of the vehicle and adjust the passenger's outside rearview mirror so you can just see the right side of your vehicle. Adjusting your mirrors slightly outward from the vehicle allows you to view more of the roadway.

Maximize visibility with enhanced mirror settings.



With these small adjustments, you can make it easier to drive safely.
