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Updates to the Triennial Highway Safety Plan (HSP)

A fundamental component of New York State’s Annual Grant Application consists of updates to its Triennial Highway Safety Plan (HSP) that reflect adjustments to countermeasure strategies for programming funds across each program area. The following reflects 2026 updates to New York’s Triennial HSP across each of the State’s program areas: Impaired Driving, Police Traffic Services, Motorcycle Safety, Nonmotorized, Occupant Protection, Community Traffic Safety Programs, Traffic Records, and Planning & Administration.

Impaired Driving

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

Countermeasure Strategies


New York State identified eight countermeasure strategies for the Impaired Driving Program area in the FFY 2024-2026 Triennial HSP. These strategies address the issues identified in the problem identification process and inform the types of projects to be implemented.

- Strategy AL-1: Enforcement of Impaired Driving Laws
- Strategy AL-2: Prosecution and Adjudication of DWI Offenders
- Strategy AL-3: DWI Offender Treatment, Monitoring, Control
- Strategy AL-4: Prevention, Communications, Public Information, and Educational Outreach
- Strategy AL-5: Underage Drinking and Alcohol-Impaired Driving
- Strategy AL-6: Drugged Driving
- Strategy AL-7: Cooperative Approaches to Reducing Impaired Driving
- Strategy AL-8: Research, Evaluation, and Analytical Support for New York’s Performance-Based Impaired Driving Program

Performance Measures and Targets

In New York State’s Triennial HSP, three performance measures were selected for the Impaired Driving Program area. The performance measures were developed based on the NHTSA guideline “Traffic Safety Performance Measures for States and Federal Agencies” (DOT HS 811 025). The performance targets set for each measure and the assessment of progress toward those targets are provided below:


Performance Measure	<u>C-5 Alcohol-Impaired Driving Fatalities (FARS)</u>
Performance Target	Reduce the five-year moving average to 305.9 by 2026.
Assessment of Progress	Not on track to meet target – Although the number of alcohol-impaired driving fatalities decreased by 15% from 383 in 2022 to 325 in 2023, the five-year moving average remains high at 332.0, indicating that the 2026 target of 305.9 is not on track to be met.

Persons Injured in Alcohol-Related Crashes (State Data)¹
Reduce the five-year moving average to 4,951.4 by 2026.
Target met – The five-year moving average was on a downward trend between 2019 and 2023. Based on the 2023 Accident Information System (AIS) data, the five-year moving average target of 4,951.4 set for 2026 was met and exceeded.

Performance Measure Fatalities in Drug-Related Crashes (State Data)²


¹ An alcohol-related crash is a crash that has at least one of these factors: (1) “Alcohol Involvement” was reported as a contributing factor on the police accident report, (2) a ticket was issued for alcohol-impaired driving, or (3) a positive BAC was reported.

² A drug-related crash is a crash that has at least one of these factors: (1) “Drugs (Illegal)” or “Prescription Medication” was reported as a contributing factor on the police accident report, (2) a ticket was issued for a drug-impaired driving violation, or (3) an individual had a positive drug test result.

Performance Target
Assessment of Progress

Reduce the five-year moving average to 295.7 by 2026.

On track to meet target – Although the number of fatalities in drug-related crashes has fluctuated over the five-year period, the most recent AIS data for this measure shows a decline from 425 in 2022 to 304 in 2023. As a result, the five-year moving average decreased slightly from 338.2 to 336.2, indicating that the target set for 2026 may be achieved.



Problem Identification Related to Targets Not on Track to Be Met

Since the target for reducing alcohol-impaired driving fatalities is not on track to be met and fatalities in drug-related crashes are yet to show a consistent downward trend, additional data analyses were conducted on these issues using the state’s AIS crash data and citation/adjudication data. The following are the key findings for 2023:

- Alcohol-related fatal and personal injury (F&PI) crashes happened more frequently on weekends than on weekdays, while drug-related F&PI crashes occurred relatively consistently throughout the week.
- Most alcohol-related F&PI crashes (65%) took place between 6:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m., with the fewest occurring between 6:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Drug-related F&PI crashes were most frequent from 3:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and least frequent from midnight to 9:00 a.m.
- F&PI crashes related to substance use were more frequent from May to August, with December also showing notable occurrences.
- The Upstate region³ was overrepresented in both alcohol-related and drug-related F&PI crashes (56% and 68%, respectively, vs. 40% of all F&PI crashes).
- Three-quarters of the drinking drivers in F&PI crashes were men; three-quarters of the drug-related drivers in F&PI crashes were men.

³ The state is divided into three regions for purposes of analysis: Upstate, Long Island and New York City. The Upstate region consists of the 55 counties north of New York City, the Long Island region includes the two counties of Nassau and Suffolk, and the New York City region is comprised of five counties (Bronx, Kings, New York, Queens and Richmond).

- Drinking drivers and drug-related drivers in the age groups 21-29 and 30-39 were overrepresented in F&PI crashes when compared to the proportions of licensed drivers in those age groups.
- Despite a slight increase in the number of drivers arrested for impaired driving statewide from 2022 to 2023 (29,561 to 31,140), the 2023 figure remains 21% lower than the pre-pandemic level of 39,607 recorded in 2019.
- Of the drivers arrested for impaired driving (VTL 1192.1-4) under Traffic Safety Law Enforcement and Disposition (TSLED) whose cases had been adjudicated, the dismissal/acquittal rate followed an upward trend, increasing from 11% in 2019 to 16% in 2023. The dismissal/acquittal rate was higher among drivers with drug charges only (30%) compared to those with alcohol charges only (14%).

Key Strategies Related to the Targets Not on Track to Be Met

Although all eight strategies selected for the Impaired Driving Program area address the problems of fatalities in alcohol-related and drug-related motor vehicle crashes, the following were identified as the key strategies to be adjusted because they address the main issues identified in the problem identification analyses.

Strategy AL-1 Enforcement of Impaired Driving Laws

Strategy AL-2: Prosecution and Adjudication of DWI Offenders

Strategy AL-4: Prevention, Communications, Public Information and Educational Outreach

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategies for Programming Funds

The following adjustments will be made to selected strategies in New York's FFY 2024-2026 Triennial HSP to support reductions in alcohol-related and drug-related fatalities in motor vehicle crashes.

- Strategy AL-1, AL-2, AL-6: GTSC will expand training for law enforcement officers to increase their skills in detecting impaired drivers on the roadways and to effectively testify at court proceedings. GTSC will support additional Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE) courses offered for local law enforcement agencies. Additionally, special attention will be given to encouraging local law enforcement to prioritize Standardized Field Sobriety Testing refresher courses for officers. Better trained and prepared patrol officers are more likely to conduct thorough investigations, decreasing the likelihood of a dismissal.
- Strategy AL-1, AL-6: GTSC will work with local police agencies on utilizing roadside oral fluid devices. Policies and procedures created by other departments will be shared to assist in creating local policies. The goal of using the roadside oral fluid devices is to give officers another tool to assist with identifying drugged drivers. Although a driver's impairment may be apparent, officers often lack confidence in connecting that impairment with the use of a drug.⁴ By utilizing this tool, in conjunction with the administration of standardized field sobriety tests, it will build officers' confidence in connecting the observed impairment to recent drug use, thereby

⁴ New York State law requires law enforcement to identify the impairing substance, and the substance must be on Public Health Law 3306 for a driver to be successfully prosecuted for Driving While Ability Impaired by Drugs or Driving While Ability Impaired by the Combined Influence of any Drug or Drugs.

encouraging law enforcement to request a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) to further the investigation. This will increase the utilization of DREs within New York State and ultimately hold more drugged drivers accountable. These devices also have a QR code requiring law enforcement to record data, such as “Was a DRE called?” and “Did a DRE respond?”, allowing the highway safety office to ensure optimal distribution of DREs across the entire state.

- Strategy AL-2, AL-6: GTSC has expanded the Traffic Safety Resource Prosecutors (TSRP) program to have regional TSRPs, one upstate and one downstate. GTSC is also working on adding a third supervisory TSRP to ensure an overall consistent message and training curriculum as well as providing direct support for central New York State. The goal of the TSRPs is to promote a more unified, multidisciplinary approach to the prosecution of all types of vehicular crimes throughout the state. The TSRPs collaborate with agencies throughout New York, including District Attorneys’ Offices, law enforcement agencies, local and state crime laboratories, medical examiners’ offices, highway safety boards, and victim advocacy groups, as well as the National District Attorneys Association and the National Traffic Law Center. TSRPs are essential for ensuring consistent, accurate, and effective handling of traffic crimes across the state, which significantly impact public safety. The TSRPs will look for additional ways to support prosecutors with the goal of reducing the number of dismissals and acquittals. By acting as a bridge between the courtroom and the roadway, TSRPs enhance the criminal justice system's capacity to hold dangerous drivers accountable and ultimately reduce traffic-related injuries and fatalities.
- Strategy AL-1, AL-6: GTSC will work with county emergency services across the state to create a regionalized DRE callout system. A regionalized callout system will allow for better DRE response times and provide more consistent coverage for agencies currently lacking DREs. Also, the callout system will track if calls went unanswered, which will assist in ensuring the DREs are properly distributed across the state.
- Strategy AL-1, AL-4: GTSC will work with the DMV’s Office of Communications to develop and implement a comprehensive impaired driving multimedia campaign. Tentatively branded as “Impaired Is Impaired,” this public awareness effort will focus messaging on the toxic cocktail of alcohol, drugs, and prescription medication as a factor in impaired driving crashes. Collateral, much of which will draw on the experience of victim advocates, will be developed to support a coordinated, year-round media activation consisting of public service announcements, billboards, targeted social media, and other initiatives.



Performance Measures and Targets

In New York State's Triennial HSP, two performance measures were selected for the Police Traffic Services Program area. The performance measures were developed based on the NHTSA guideline "Traffic Safety Performance Measures for States and Federal Agencies" (DOT HS 811 025). The performance targets set for each measure and the assessment of progress toward those targets are provided below:


Performance Measure	<u>C-6 Number of Speed-Related Fatalities (FARS)</u>
Performance Target	Reduce the five-year moving average to 326.6 by 2026.
Assessment of Progress	Not on track to meet target – The number of speed-related fatalities decreased by 15% from 2022 to 2023. However, the upward trend in the five-year moving average continued in 2023, indicating that the target of 326.6 set for 2026 is not on track to be met.



Performance Measure Fatal and Personal Injury Crashes Involving Cell Phone Use or Texting (State Data)

Performance Target Reduce the five-year moving average to 474.4 by 2026.

Assessment of Progress **Target met** – The five-year moving average was on a downward trend between 2019 and 2023. Based on the 2023 AIS data, the five-year moving average target of 474.4 set for 2026 was met and exceeded.



Problem Identification Related to the Target Not on Track to Be Met

Since the target for reducing speed-related fatalities is not on track to be met, additional data analyses were conducted on this issue using the state's AIS crash data and citation data. The following are the key findings for 2023:

- Speed-related crashes accounted for 30% of fatal crashes and 12% of personal injury crashes. Both percentages were higher than those observed before the pandemic.
- Speed-related F&PI crashes tended to happen more frequently from Friday to Sunday and during the hours of 3:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m.
- Drivers in the age groups 16-20 and 21-29 were significantly over-represented among speeding drivers in F&PI crashes and among those ticketed for speeding, compared to their proportions in the overall population of licensed drivers.
- The Upstate region was over-represented in speeding drivers in F&PI crashes (57%) as well as drivers ticketed for speeding (73%) when compared to the proportion of licensed drivers in the region (49%).
- From 2019 to 2023, speed-related fatalities rose by 35% in New York City, 27% in Upstate and 33% in Long Island.
- Among the ten counties with the highest number of fatalities or injuries from speed-related crashes, the most significant percentage increases from 2019 to 2023 were recorded in Bronx (61%), New York (56%), Kings (33%), Queens (25%), Orange (21%), and Westchester (17%). The remaining counties saw little change or a decrease: Suffolk (1%), Nassau (0%), Monroe (-12%), and Erie (-14%).

- A total of 535,081 speeding tickets were issued across the state, reflecting a 2% rise compared to 2022. However, this figure is 20% lower than the pre-pandemic total of 676,925 tickets in 2019.

Key Strategies Related to the Target Not on Track to Be Met

The following strategies were identified as the key strategies to be adjusted because they address the main issues identified in the problem identification analyses.

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategies for Programming Funds

The following adjustments will be made to selected strategies in New York’s FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan to support reductions in speed-related fatalities.

- Strategy PTS-1, PTS-3: GTSC will reassess recent data related to speed-related crashes. Based on these analyses, GTSC will continue to target high-risk hotspots throughout New York State, including New York City, with a comprehensive speeding media campaign in partnership with the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles’ Office of Communications. A new media campaign is currently in development. The developing media plan will include targeted social media campaigns, featuring new and existing messaging, as well as new and existing public service announcements for both radio and television, aimed at reducing speeds and speed-related crashes.
- Strategy PTS-1, PTS-3: GTSC will continue to conduct multiple statewide “Speed Awareness Week” enforcement and engagement mobilizations to promote safer speeds across New York State. GTSC will further develop its plan and efforts to conduct outreach efforts with regional Chambers of Commerce to further GTSC’s partnership with employers to provide their employees with traffic safety education, specifically highlighting the dangers of speeding. That effort coincides with the identified at-risk populations and incident days and times for speed-related crashes, which is the 21-29 age group, during weekdays, lunch hours, and the “happy hour” time block. An additional “Speed Awareness Enforcement and Engagement Campaign,” in partnership with the New York Police Department, will be conducted within New York City’s five boroughs. The selected period for this campaign will be based on the crash data risk profile for the region opposed to coinciding with statewide “Speed Awareness Week” mobilizations.
- Strategy PTS-1, PTS-3: GTSC will continue partnerships with regional sports teams, like the efforts GTSC has engaged in with the Rochester Red Wings and Long Island Ducks. These efforts, combined with a targeted multimedia campaign, proved valuable in reaching identified at-risk communities in targeted locations, as well as providing an additional conduit to provide speed-related and other traffic safety education and outreach to at risk communities. Previous campaigns in Rochester overdelivered on projections and resulted in over 5.5 million impressions across Instagram, TikTok, YouTube, and streaming television.
- Strategy PTS-1, PTS-3: GTSC will continue exploring additional educational outreach avenues using press events in the winter months to address the bulk of speed-related crashes in New York State. These efforts are tailored around driving appropriately according to the weather

conditions with “speed reasonable and prudent.” They will include the New York State Police (NYSP), New York State Department of Transportation (DOT), and other state and regional partners.



Assessment of Progress	Not on track to meet target – The number of motorcyclist fatalities increased from 188 in 2022 to 201 in 2023. As a result, the upward trend in the five-year moving average continued in 2023, indicating that the target of 166.5 is not on track to be met.





Reduce the five-year moving average to 16.15 by 2026.

Not on track to meet target – The number of unhelmeted motorcyclist fatalities decreased in 2023. However, the upward trend in the five-year moving average continued in 2023, indicating that the target of 16.15 set for 2026 is not on track to be met.



Motorcyclists Injured in Crashes (State Data)

Reduce the five-year moving average to 3,780.0 by 2026.


Not on track to meet target – The number of motorcyclists injured in crashes increased by 14% from 2022 to 2023. As a result, the five-year moving average increased from 3,823.2 in 2022 to 3,979.0 in 2023, indicating that the target set for 2026 is not on track to be met.



Performance Measure Fatal and Personal Injury Crashes Involving a Motorcycle and Another Vehicle in High-Risk Counties (State Data)⁵

Performance Target Reduce the five-year moving average to 1,292.3 by 2026.

Assessment of Progress **Not on track to meet target** – The number of F&PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another vehicle in high-risk counties increased by 42% from 2022 to 2023. As a result, the upward trend in the five-year moving average continued in 2023, indicating that the target set for 2026 is not on track to be met.



Problem Identification Related to the Targets Not on Track to Be Met

Since the targets for reducing 1) motorcyclist fatalities, 2) unhelmeted motorcyclist fatalities, 3) motorcyclists injured in crashes, and 4) fatal and personal injury (F&PI) crashes involving a motorcycle and another vehicle in high-risk counties are not on track to be met, additional analyses were conducted on these issues using the state’s AIS crash data. The following are the key findings for 2023:

- New York City was overrepresented in F&PI motorcycle crashes (44%) compared to the proportion of motorcycle licenses (14%) and registrations (15%) in the region. Between 2022 and 2023, F&PI motorcycle crashes rose by 48% in New York City, whereas Upstate saw a 7% decline, and Long Island experienced a 3% rise.
- The counties with the greatest number of F&PI motorcycle crashes were Queens (646), Kings (569), Bronx (398), New York (359), Suffolk (307), and Nassau (246).
- F&PI motorcycle crashes occurred more frequently during the months of May through October and from Noon to 9:00 p.m.
- Motorcycle operators aged 16-39 were overrepresented in F&PI crashes (61% of motorcycle operators in crashes vs. 19% of licensed motorcyclists).
- Seven out of ten F&PI motorcycle crashes involved a collision with another motor vehicle.

⁵ The high-risk counties are Queens, Kings, Bronx, New York, Suffolk, and Nassau. These counties have consistently ranked in the top six for F&PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another motor vehicle since 2013.

- In F&PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another motor vehicle, the top contributing factors for motorcycle operators were “Passing/Unsafe Lane Changing,” “Driver Inattention/Distraction” and “Unsafe Speed;” the top contributing factors for other motor vehicle operators were “Failure to Yield Right-of-Way” and “Driver Inattention/Distraction.”
- Kings, Queens, Bronx, and New York counties accounted for 54% of the statewide F&PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another motor vehicle. From 2022 to 2023, these crashes increased by 73% in Bronx, 68% in Queens, 53% in New York, and 30% in Kings.

Key Strategies Related to the Targets Not on Track to Be Met

The following strategies were identified as the key strategies to be adjusted because they address the main issues identified in the problem identification analyses.

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategies for Programming Funds

The following adjustments will be made to selected strategies in New York’s FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan to support reductions in 1) motorcyclist fatalities, 2) unhelmeted motorcyclist fatalities, 3) motorcyclists injured in crashes, and 4) F&PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another vehicle in high-risk counties.

- Strategy MC-3: GTSC plans to expand and improve the coursework presented in motorcycle classes conducted for law enforcement officers each year in collaboration with the New York State Police and the Colonie Police Department. Officers from police agencies in high-risk counties for motorcycle crashes are encouraged to attend these training courses, which focus on the unique challenges associated with motorcycle enforcement on the roadway. The classroom presentation will be augmented with updated data and information on enforcing compliance with any new or updated laws and regulations.
- Strategy MC-2: In F&PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another motor vehicle, the top contributing factors are different between motorcycle operators and other motorists. GTSC will continue to collaborate with member agencies on data-driven, relevant public service announcements to provide the motoring public with visual representations of the risks and contributing factors involved in motorcycle crashes. GTSC will utilize the most current contributing factor data to inform the selection of impactful messages when creating new public service announcements.
- Strategy MC-2: The number of F&PI crashes involving a motorcycle and another vehicle in high-risk counties increased by 42% from 2022 to 2023. Because riders benefit from increased public awareness of motorcycles on the road, GTSC will focus on placing motorcycle safety messaging in high-risk counties by utilizing strategically placed gas nozzle-toppers and geo-targeted social media campaigns.



Assessment of Progress	Not on track to meet target – The number of pedestrian fatalities decreased by 5% from 2022 to 2023. However, the five-year moving average continued to increase in 2023, indicating that the target of 258.1 set for 2026 is not on track to be met.

Reduce the five-year moving average to 40.2 by 2026

Not on track to meet target – The five-year moving average increased from 42.0 in 2022 to 45.8 in 2023, indicating that the target of 40.2 set for 2026 is not on track to be met.



Target Met –The downward trend in the five-year moving average continued in 2023. Based on the 2023 data, the target of 13,807.9 set for 2026 was met and exceeded.



Number of Bicyclists Injured in Crashes (State Data)

Reduce the five-year moving average to 6,027.0 by 2026

Not on track to meet target – The upward trend in the five-year moving average continued in 2023, indicating that the target of 6,027.0 set for 2026 is not on track to be met.



Problem Identification Related to the Targets Not on Track to Be Met

Since the targets for reducing 1) pedestrian fatalities, 2) bicyclist fatalities, and 3) bicyclist injuries are not on track to be met, additional analyses were conducted on these issues using the state’s AIS crash data. The following are the key findings for 2023:

Pedestrian Safety

- “Failure to Yield Right of Way” and “Driver Inattention/Distracted” were the top contributing factors for motorists in both fatal crashes involving pedestrians and personal injury crashes involving pedestrians.
- The largest proportion of fatal crashes involving pedestrians (32%) occurred when the pedestrian was crossing with no signal or crosswalk; the largest proportion of personal injury crashes involving pedestrians (31%) occurred when the pedestrian was crossing with a signal.
- When compared to the population in each region, Long Island was overrepresented in pedestrian fatalities (24% of the fatalities vs. 15% of the population), whereas New York City was overrepresented in pedestrian injuries (71% of the injuries vs. 42% of the population).
- Compared to 2019, pedestrian fatalities in New York City decreased by 17%, whereas those in the Upstate region and Long Island rose by 27% and 22%, respectively.
- The largest proportion of fatal crashes involving pedestrians (46%) occurred between 6:00 p.m. and midnight.
- The 15-34 age group had the highest rate of pedestrian fatalities and injuries per 10,000 population.

Bicycle Safety

- Compared to the population distribution in each region, New York City was overrepresented in bicyclist injuries (73% of injuries vs. 42% of the population). Both New York City and Long Island were slightly overrepresented in bicyclist fatalities.
- Compared to 2019, the number of bicyclists killed or injured in crashes in New York City rose by 43%, whereas those in the Upstate region and Long Island rose by 18% and 14%, respectively.
- “Driver Inattention/Distraction,” “Failure to Yield Right of Way,” and “Bicyclist Error/Confusion” were the top contributing factors in bicycle-related F&PI crashes.
- F&PI crashes involving bicycles were more common on weekdays than on weekends.
- Bicyclists aged 25-34 (27%) and 15-24 (26%) accounted for the largest proportions of bicyclists killed or injured in crashes.
- Bicycle-related F&PI crashes were most common between 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m., followed by 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.

Key Strategies Related to the Targets Not on Track to Be Met

The following strategies were identified as the key strategies to be adjusted because they address the main issues identified in the problem identification analyses.

Strategy PS-1: Education, Communication, and Outreach

Strategy PS-2: Community-Based Programs in Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety

Strategy PS-3: Cooperative Approaches to Improving Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety

Strategy PS-4: Enforcement of Traffic Violations

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategies for Programming Funds

The following adjustments will be made to selected strategies in New York’s FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan to support reductions in 1) pedestrian fatalities, 2) bicyclist fatalities, and 3) bicyclists injured in crashes.

- Strategy PS-1, PS-4: GTSC will collaborate with the New York Bicycling Coalition to develop a training course designed for micromobility users. The course will be targeted at newer or less experienced e-bike and e-scooter users, focusing on applicable vehicle and traffic laws and how to accelerate, brake, and ride safely. The New York Bicycling Coalition’s updated pocket guide and e-bike/e-scooter rack cards will be distributed to provide guidance on practicing or acclimating to an e-bike or e-scooter before riding in traffic.
- Strategy PS-3: GTSC will work with the New York Bicycling Coalition to develop a new “Active Transportation Law and Safety in New York” law enforcement training curriculum. Topics will include standard bicycle and micromobility device laws and safety, who may operate or be passengers on such devices, and where they may be used; equipment requirements and helmet fitting; citing and educating offenders; and bicycle, e-bike, and e-scooter crash response, investigation, and reporting. Other topics include laws relating to motorist interactions with active transportation users, as well as state laws and local laws or ordinances.
- Strategy PS-4: GTSC and its traffic safety partners will work with the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles to update both the Police Crash Report (MV-104A/AN) and the Motorist Crash Report (MV-104) to allow for the collection of crash data specifically for e-bikes and e-scooters. Currently, crash reporting instruments and laws do not consistently capture crash data for e-

bikes and e-scooters. Corresponding changes to crash report forms will enable law enforcement and motorists to begin providing crash reports specifically for e-bikes and e-scooters. The collection and analysis of this data will assist GTSC and its traffic safety partners in making informed decisions regarding changes in regulations, enforcement, education, and the environment.

- Strategy PS-1, PS-2, PS-3: Data analysis indicates New York City is overrepresented in bicyclist fatalities and injuries, as well as pedestrian injuries. To mitigate these crashes, GTSC will partner with the New York City Department of Transportation to conduct awareness trainings related to the use of e-bicycles and e-scooters. These events will provide e-bike and e-scooter users with information on traffic safety laws, guidance on driving e-bikes and e-scooters safely in the city, and education on illegal vehicles. Educational materials will be distributed to local shops that sell and repair e-micro-mobility vehicles.
- Strategy PS-1: New York’s crash data shows the top contributing factors in bicycle crashes continue to be Driver Inattention/Distraction, Failure to Yield Right of Way, and Bicycle Error/Confusion. To address this issue, GTSC will continue to emphasize law-based programming (in-person and/or virtual) to educate bicyclists and drivers on New York’s conditional yielding law and other rules of the road, which may not be fully understood by casual cyclists. As part of this initiative, GTSC is developing a new comprehensive micromobility media campaign with DMV’s Office of Communications. This messaging will be disseminated through various publications and distribution formats. Educational materials will state e-bikes and e-scooters are only legal for those 16 years of age and older.
- Strategy PS-3: GTSC will expand its efforts to recruit new partners who focus on bicycle safety. Collaborating with new partners will amplify outreach efforts, allowing GTSC to effectively engage communities that may have been previously underrepresented. GTSC will recruit new partners focusing on pedestrian safety for seniors.
- Strategy PS-1: GTSC will develop targeted safety messages to educate drivers and bicyclists about applicable laws and best practices for coexisting safely on the road. GTSC will collaborate with DMV’s Office of Communications to explore new delivery channels, including advanced social media targeting, search and programmatic display ads, and other out-of-home advertising opportunities. The campaigns will be multilingual and will target ZIP Codes with the highest number of e-bike injuries and crashes. DMV’s Office of Communications will also reimagine the “Walk, Bike, & Roll New York” logo to incorporate micromobility.


New York State identified eight countermeasure strategies for the Occupant Protection Program area in the FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan. These strategies address the issues identified in the problem identification process and inform the types of projects to be implemented.

- Strategy OP-1 Seat Belt Enforcement
- Strategy OP-2 Communications and Outreach
- Strategy OP-3 Child Passenger Safety Communications and Outreach
- Strategy OP-4 Car Seat Fitting Stations
- Strategy OP-5 Car Seat Check Events
- Strategy OP-6 Recruitment and Training of Child Passenger Safety Technicians
- Strategy OP-7 Car Seat Education & Distribution Programs
- Strategy OP-8 Research, Evaluation, and Analytical Support for New York's Performance-Based Occupant Protection Program

Performance Measures and Targets

In New York State's Triennial HSP, two performance measures were selected for the Occupant Protection Program area. The performance measures were developed based on the NHTSA guideline "Traffic Safety Performance Measures for States and Federal Agencies" (DOT HS 811 025). The performance targets set for each measure and the assessment of progress toward those targets are provided below:

Performance Measure	<u>B-1 Observed Seat Belt Use by Front Seat Occupants in Passenger Vehicles (State Survey)</u>
Performance Target	Increase to 93.28% by 2026.
Assessment of Progress	Not on track to meet target – The seat belt use rate fluctuated over the past four years, with lows of 91.9% in 2022 and 2024, and a peak of 94.1% in 2023, indicating that the target of 93.28% is not on track to be met.





C-4 Unrestrained Passenger Vehicle Occupant Fatalities (FARS)

Decrease the five-year moving average to 164.3 by 2026

Not on track to meet target – Unrestrained passenger vehicle occupant fatalities decreased by 10% from 2022 to 2023. However, the upward trend in the five-year moving average continued in 2023, indicating that the target of 164.3 set for 2026 is not on track to be met.

Problem Identification Related to the Targets Not on Track to Be Met

Since the targets for 1) increasing observed seat belt use by front seat occupants in passenger vehicles and 2) reducing unrestrained passenger vehicle occupant fatalities are not on track to be met, additional data analyses were conducted on these issues using the state's AIS crash data and citation/adjudication data. The following are the key findings for 2023:

- Motor vehicle occupants killed or injured were more likely to be unrestrained when alcohol or speed was involved in the crash.
- Motor vehicle occupants killed or injured in crashes were more likely to be unrestrained during the late-night and early morning hours (midnight-6:00 a.m.) than during the day and early evening (6:00 a.m.-9:00 p.m.).
- 83% of the unrestrained motor vehicle occupants killed were riding in the front seat.
- Three-quarters of the unrestrained motor vehicle occupants killed in crashes were male.
- 39% of the unrestrained motor vehicle occupants killed were 21-39 years of age; only 3% were under 16 years of age.
- Unrestrained motor vehicle occupant fatalities were most likely to occur on Saturday.
- The Upstate region was considerably overrepresented in unrestrained motor vehicle occupant fatalities (43% of the population vs. 73% of the unrestrained fatalities).
- Even with a 4% increase in 2023, the number of seat belt tickets issued remained significantly lower than pre-pandemic levels, showing a 26% drop from 2019 to 2023.

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategies for Programming Funds

The following adjustments will be made to selected strategies in New York's FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan to support improvements in observed seat belt use by front-seat occupants in passenger vehicles and unrestrained passenger vehicle occupant fatalities:

- Strategy OP-1: Enforcement of the state's seat belt laws will continue to be the primary strategy for occupant protection. For FFY 2026, GTSC will focus on expanding enforcement efforts into those areas of the state that have not been involved in past statewide seat belt enforcement efforts. In addition, GTSC will continue efforts to increase overall seatbelt enforcement by promoting and encouraging participation in initiatives in new locations. GTSC will also provide countywide crash heatmapping to existing grantees to assist them in allocating patrols to high-crash areas within their jurisdiction ahead of the nationwide Click It or Ticket initiative.
- Strategy OP-2: According to the state's crash data, a large proportion of killed unrestrained motor vehicle occupants were from a younger (21-39) demographic. To address this issue, GTSC will create digital and social media campaigns specifically tailored to drivers in this age group. These campaigns will utilize platforms popular among this demographic, as traditional media sources, such as television, are less effective in reaching them. Outdoor advertising will be strategically positioned in locations frequented by younger adults, such as concerts, fairs, and sporting events. Outreach in FFY 2026 will include more focused efforts

in upstate areas, where there is an increased number of fatal unrestrained crashes. Upstate efforts will be concentrated on counties with high rates of non-compliance.

Updates to Data

Performance measures and relevant charts and tables referenced in the FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan have been updated with the most recent data and included in the FFY 2026 Occupant Protection Plan prepared as part of New York's Section 405b application.



Performance Measures and Targets

In New York State's Triennial HSP, one performance measure was selected for the Community Traffic Safety Programs area. The performance measure was developed based on the NHTSA guideline "Traffic Safety Performance Measures for States and Federal Agencies" (DOT HS 811 025). The performance target set for the measure and the assessment of progress toward the target are provided below:

Performance Measure	<u>C-9 Drivers Age 21 or Younger Involved in Fatal Crashes (FARS)</u>
Performance Target	Reduce the five-year moving average to 95.7 by 2026
Assessment of Progress	Not on track to meet target – The number of drivers under age 21 involved in fatal crashes increased from 115 in 2022 to 134 in 2023. As a result, the upward trend in the five-year moving average continued in 2023, indicating that the target of 95.7 set for 2026 is not on track to be met.



Problem Identification Related to the Target Not on Track to Be Met

Since the target for reducing drivers under age 21 involved in fatal crashes is not on track to be met, additional data analyses were conducted on the characteristics of young drivers (16-20) in fatal and personal injury (F&PI) crashes using the state's AIS crash data. The following are the key findings:

- Young drivers had the highest risk of being involved in crashes. Despite comprising only 4% of all licensed drivers, they accounted for 9% of drivers involved in fatal crashes and 7% of drivers in injury crashes.
- The most common contributing factor associated with young drivers in fatal crashes was Unsafe Speed (41%), followed by Passing/Unsafe Lane Changing (12%) and Driver Inattention/Distracted (9%).
- The most common contributing factors associated with young drivers in personal injury crashes were Failure to Yield the Right-of-Way (16%), Driver Inattention/Distracted (15%), Following Too Closely (14%), and Unsafe Speed (13%).
- When compared with all drivers in fatal crashes, young drivers in fatal crashes were more likely to have Unsafe Speed and Driver Inattention/Distracted as contributing factors.
- When compared with all drivers in personal injury crashes, young drivers in personal injury crashes were more likely to have Failure to Yield the Right-of-Way, Unsafe Speed, and Following Too Closely as contributing factors.

Key Strategies Related to the Target Not on Track to Be Met

The following strategies were identified as the key strategies to be adjusted because they address the main issues identified in the problem identification analyses.

Strategy CP-3: Statewide Communications and Outreach

Strategy CP-4: Younger Driver Outreach and Education

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategies for Programming Funds

The following adjustments will be made to selected strategies in New York's FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan to support reductions in the number of drivers under age 21 involved in fatal crashes.

- Strategy CP-3: According to the state's crash data, speeding and distracted driving are among the most common contributing factors in young driver fatal crashes. To address these issues, GTSC will launch a statewide, targeted multi-media campaign to raise awareness about the dangers of speeding and distracted driving. The campaign utilizes media platforms popular amongst teens and young adults to disseminate engaging content, including videos, infographics, and testimonials. Based on the state's crash data, which shows younger drivers are more likely to be involved in F&PI crashes, additional emphasis will be placed on reaching younger drivers through the statewide campaigns by working with teen "safe driving ambassadors" to develop messaging specifically geared toward younger drivers.
- Strategy CP-4: Many of the top contributing factors identified in the state's crash data point to a need for more driver education, specifically targeting younger drivers. To help address the need for additional education among young drivers, GTSC plans to work with its highway safety partners to create Peer-to-Peer Education Programs. Expanding peer-led initiatives within high schools and communities will help promote safe driving behaviors. These efforts will include

training peer leaders, developing interactive workshops, and creating digital content that resonates with young drivers. GTSC also plans to create a Teen Traffic Safety Leadership Workshop empowering teens to become ambassadors for safe driving within their communities. By providing comprehensive training in advocacy, public speaking, and organizing local safety campaigns, these workshops aim to equip young drivers with the skills and knowledge necessary to effectively promote safe driving behaviors. GTSC program staff have started developing this program by learning about initiatives led by AAA, and other state highway safety offices with similar programs in place.

No new performance measures have been added within the Community Traffic Safety Programs area.

Traffic Records

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

Countermeasure Strategies

New York State identified five countermeasure strategies for the Traffic Records Program area in the FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan. Collectively, these strategies address issues related to the timeliness, accuracy, completeness, uniformity, integration, and accessibility of the state’s various traffic records systems and inform the types of projects to be implemented. The strategies reflect the findings from the work undertaken by the state’s Traffic Records Coordinating Council (TRCC) to prepare the NHTSA-required annual Traffic Safety Information Systems (TSIS) Strategic Plan.

- Strategy TR-1: Implementation of Improvements to TSIS Systems
- Strategy TR-2: Development and Use of Data Linkages
- Strategy TR-3: Use of Technology to Disseminate Data and Information
- Strategy TR-4: Statewide Coordination of Traffic Records Systems Improvements
- Strategy TR-5: Research and Evaluation

Performance Measures and Targets

Through voting conducted via the Traffic Records Coordinating Committee, six performance measures were selected for inclusion in the FFY 2025 Traffic Safety Information Systems Strategic Plan.⁶ The 2025 performance target set for each of the six measures and the assessment of progress toward those targets are provided below. Based on NHTSA guidelines, the baseline period covered the twelve-month period of April 1, 2023-March 31, 2024, and the performance period covered the twelve-month period of April 1, 2024-March 31, 2025.

Assessment of Progress **Target not met** – The percentage increased from 87.21% in the baseline period to 87.70% in the performance period.

Assessment of Progress **Target met** – The mean number of days decreased from 5.65 days in the baseline period to 5.48 days in the performance period.

Performance Target Reduce to 18.33 days during the performance period

Assessment of Progress **Target not met** – The mean number of days increased from 18.52 days in the baseline period to 27.40 days in the performance period.

Performance Measure Mean Number of Days from the Date a Citation is Issued to the Date the Citation is Entered into the Administrative Adjudication (AA) Database

Performance Target Reduce to 4.95 days during the performance period

Assessment of Progress **Target not met** – The mean number of days increased from 5.00 days in the baseline period to 6.09 days in the performance period.

Although not included in the FFY 2025 Traffic Safety Information Systems Strategic Plan, a seventh traffic records-related performance measure and target were included in the FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan: the percentage of crash reports received electronically for crashes that occurred during a calendar year. Using 2021 as the baseline year (64.39%), a target of 66.01% was set for 2026.

Performance Measure Percentage of Crash Reports Received Electronically for Crashes that Occurred During a Calendar Year

Performance Target Increase to 66.01% by 2026

Assessment of Progress **Not on track to meet target** – For crashes that occurred during 2023, 64.81% of the crash reports were received electronically. In 2022, the percentage was 64.80%.

Problem Identification Related to the Targets Not Met or Not on Track to Be Met

The status of each of the state’s core traffic safety data systems (crashes, citations/adjudication, drivers, injury surveillance, vehicles and roadways) was reviewed by the TRCC and its member agencies to identify opportunities for improvement and assist in selecting countermeasure strategies and projects that will enable the state to achieve its traffic records performance goals. Key findings related to unmet or off-track targets are summarized below.

Crash Information System

- The most recent data indicates that New York is not on track to meet the 2026 target set for increasing the percentage of crash reports received electronically. Once fully implemented, the new Crash Reporting Information System (CRIS) will enable the electronic transmission of crash reports from the New York City Police Department and provide a web-based option in later phases for smaller, non-electronic police agencies and motorists to submit crash reports online. NYS DMV and Lexis Nexis are entering the final phases of the CRIS project.

- **Timeliness:** New York did not meet the target set for reducing the mean number of days from crash date to the date the crash report is entered into the AIS. The increase in this performance measure can be attributed to several factors, including the ongoing instability of the current AIS environment, staff working on the development of the new crash reporting system, and file importing issues associated with the implementation of the new NICHE system, which is now being used statewide by the New York State Police. This timeliness measure could be improved by increasing the number of police agencies that collect and submit their crash data electronically to DMV and by allowing motorists to file their crash reports electronically.
- **Accuracy:** The accuracy of the AIS critical data element of Lat/Long Coordinates did not show improvement during the past year. The slight decrease in this measure can be attributed to the ongoing integration issues between Crash Location and Engineering Analysis and Reporting (CLEAR) and AIS while updating crash cases in AIS after being processed in CLEAR. Better integration between the new crash system, CRIS, and CLEAR is needed to improve the accuracy of this field.
- **Completeness:** Completeness did not show improvement during the past year with regard to the data element of Roadway Type. An error in populating this field in CLEAR has been identified. The NYS Department of Transportation, DMV, and Institute for Traffic Safety Management and Research (ITSMR) are working together to resolve the issue.

Citation/Adjudication Information Systems

- **Timeliness:** New York did not meet the target set for reducing the mean number of days from the date a citation is adjudicated until the disposition information is entered into the TSLED database. The increase in processing time can be attributed to the temporary staff reassignments working in conjunction with the Office of Court Administration and the TSLED courts, resolving errors regarding the timely submission of Commercial Driver License/Commercial Motor Vehicle (CDL/CMV) convictions.
- **Timeliness:** New York did not meet the target set for reducing the mean number of days from the date a citation is issued to the date the citation is entered into the Administrative Adjudication (AA) database. On-boarding of additional staff will increase the likelihood of meeting this target in the future.

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategies for Programming Funds

The following adjustments will be made to selected strategies in New York's FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan to support the attainment of FFY 2026 targets set for improving New York's crash and citation/adjudication systems:

- Strategy TR-1: The implementation of the AIS Replacement project (CRIS) will remain the primary focus for many state agencies in FFY 2026. The DMV, Department of Health, DOT, ITSMR, New York Police Department (NYPD), and NYSP all need to modify their existing systems to capture, accept, and/or transmit crash data. NYS DMV will continue to collaborate with its vendor, Lexis Nexis, to advance the CRIS project. Once CRIS transitions from implementation to maintenance, the CRIS Maintenance project funded in FFY 2026 will ensure the new crash system is properly maintained and will accommodate annual changes to meet highway safety community needs, DMV policy changes, federal mandates, and state law changes.

- Strategy TR-1: Expand the capability of entering a plea (guilty or not guilty) electronically for local courts. The implementation of this project has been completed for the pilot courts in Troy, Saratoga, and New Rochelle resulting in a streamlined experience for motorists making a payment and a reduction in manual work for court clerks. The NYS Office of Court Administration will continue to expand this system beyond the pilot courts to other Unified Case Management System (UCMS) courts currently active on the Statewide-Cashiering system. Later phases will incorporate the ability for prosecutors to work with the courts and the motorists in the adjudication process. The electronic plea system will improve the timeliness of the disposition data transmitted to DMV.

Updates to Data

Performance measures and relevant tables referenced in the FFY 2024-2026 Triennial Highway Safety Plan have been updated with the most recent data.

Changes to Performance Plan

During the TRCC meetings held in 2025, the committee determined (1) the mean number of days from the date a citation is issued to the date the citation is entered into the TSLED database and (2) the mean number of days from the date a citation is issued to the date the citation is entered into the AA should be retired for FFY 2026 as they are no longer relevant performance measures. These measures have plateaued over the last several years, and the timeliness of these processes is acceptable to the stakeholders. Two new performance measures were added in the FFY 2026 Traffic Safety Information Systems Strategic Plan to track progress in other traffic records systems.

Table 1 summarizes the new performance measure and goal established for the integration attribute for the injury surveillance system in FFY 2026. The FFY 2026 goal reflects a point one percent increase from the baseline period. The AIS Replacement project, continuing in FFY 2026, will improve the accuracy and completeness of data captured in the new crash system, CRIS. This improvement should allow for better data integration and linkage processes between the crash system and the injury surveillance system.

The FFY 2026 goal reflects a seven percent increase from the baseline period. The expansion of CLEAR will allow local municipalities to respond to funding solicitations for Local Call Projects. This new feature in CLEAR should increase the number of user-generated queries.

Planning and Administration

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

Countermeasure Strategy

Performance Measures and Targets

The following performance targets are used for the Planning & Administration Program area:

- Strengthen GTSC's role in setting goals and priorities for the state's highway safety program
- Identify highway safety problems and solutions to reduce fatalities and injuries on New York State's roadways.
- Continue to promote the implementation of the state's Evidence-Based Traffic Safety Enforcement Program (TSEP).
- Provide direction, guidance, and assistance to support the efforts of public and private partners to improve highway safety.
- Develop and maintain policies and procedures that provide for the effective, efficient, and economical operation of the highway safety program.
- Continue to expand technology to disseminate traffic safety information, including online grant applications and using the internet to disseminate safety information through multi-media channels.
- Coordinate and provide training opportunities and programs for New York State's traffic safety professionals.
- Support the use of performance measures as an evaluation tool in the state's highway safety program.
- Improve the timeliness of grant approvals and the allocation and liquidation of funding.

As reported in New York's FFY24 Annual Report, GTSC was successful in meeting or making progress toward each of the targets related to the management of the state's Section 402 and Section 405 grant programs. New York will continue its performance-based planning approach for the statewide traffic safety program, as well as its other strategies for conducting and managing the state's highway safety program.

Problem Identification Related to Targets

- The state's highway safety program requires overall coordination in compliance with the requirements established under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.
- GTSC staff, with grantees and other partners, must continue to identify highway safety problems and assist in developing programs to address these problems.
- GTSC staff must provide support services for the general administration of the highway safety program.

Adjustments to Countermeasure Strategy for Programming Funds

Although progress has been made in association with the targets set for the efficient and effective implementation of the state's highway safety program, the Planning and Administration strategy will continue to be adjusted to address the problems identified and any needs and challenges that arise.

The following initiatives and activities will be undertaken, continued, or expanded to support further improvements in the planning and administration of New York's highway safety program.

- Collect and analyze crash data to identify trends and problem areas that will help direct the assignment of the state's limited resources.
- Ensure highway safety resources are allocated in the most efficient manner to effectively address the highway safety problems identified and prioritized.
- Coordinate multiple programs and partners to enhance the efficient and effective use of resources.
- Assess training needs of law enforcement, prosecutors, courts, and our other community safety partners to ensure the delivery of relevant and high-quality training programs.
- Make appropriate, up-to-date, and accurate public information and education materials available to the traffic safety community.
- Monitor grant projects to assess performance and accountability.
- Provide timely and efficient approval of county funding proposals and the allocation and liquidation of funds.

Updates to Data

No updates to data were made in the Planning & Administration Program area.

Changes to Performance Plan

No new performance measures have been added in the Planning & Administration Program area.

DRIVER AND OFFICER SAFETY EDUCATION

Overview

In the FFY 2025 Annual Grant Application, the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee applied for Section 405(i) funds under CFR Section 1300.28(d)(2) (Peace Officer Training Program) to support significant revisions to the Vehicle Stops and Traffic Enforcement curriculum in its Basic Course for Police Officers. This initiative aims not only to properly prepare recruits for real-world encounters with civilians and ensure accurate documentation of such interactions but also to provide ongoing training opportunities for active law enforcement regarding their roles and responsibilities during traffic stops.

While New York's current police officer training program meets the requirements set by the Municipal Police Training Council (MPTC), there is considerable variation in the quality of training across academies. All police academies are required to provide training on proper vehicle stops, including a "practical exercise." However, due to resource limitations, academies generally treat this requirement as a final evaluation rather than a natural component of the training environment. GTSC, in partnership with the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services Office of Public Safety (NYS DCJS OPS), aims to create fully contextualized training using live, in-person, real-world traffic stop scenarios through the incorporation of the technology and equipment utilized by police into the training environment.

GTSC was awarded \$1,027,551.83 on September 30, 2024, to begin implementing this initiative. The funds will be used to:

1. Expand and update the traffic stop scenarios in the Basic Training Course, focusing on best practices for civilians and police officers during traffic stops to ensure procedural justice.
2. Provide the necessary equipment to make the simulations as realistic as possible.
3. Make the updated real-world scenario training, incorporating the latest court decisions and current law, available to all law enforcement.

Performance Measures and Targets

NYS DCJS OPS maintains the MPTC's Basic Course for Police Officers. OPS's goal is to design and facilitate the delivery of contextually relevant training, as this has been shown to improve learning and retention and enhance skill performance. OPS and GTSC seek to develop a module of training that enhances contextual relevance by incorporating tools used by police officers and increasing the use of scenario-based learning.

In a survey conducted of academy directors in 2024, 16 academies indicated they would like assistance with further contextualizing their learning environment related to traffic enforcement. These academies represent approximately 29% of municipal police recruits (not including the New York Police Department) in New York State from 2021 to 2023. During this three-year period, these academies graduated a total of 990 municipal police recruits. With full implementation, OPS expects to train approximately 1,200 police recruits annually, not including the NYPD.

The following performance target was set for FFY 2026:

- ❖ Complete development of the contextualized learning environment needed for one pilot site.

Problem Identification

Scenario training enhances learning outcomes using realistic, context-rich scenarios, improving skills retention and application. Key benefits include increased learning effectiveness, reduced anxiety, and higher engagement through immersive scenes and interactive clues.⁷ It also boosts self-confidence with scenario-based practical training.⁸ Immersion and engagement are improved by aligning tasks with realistic equipment and conditions.⁹ Skill development and error reduction occur as students apply theory in practical settings.¹⁰ Professional knowledge and capability are developed by experiencing real-world situations, supporting the transition to expertise.^{11,12} Overall, scenario training provides a contextualized environment that enhances engagement, confidence, and skill application across various educational settings.

While there have been efforts to boost the use of student-centered education models, police academy training largely relies upon classroom-based lecture training to teach new knowledge and skills to recruit police officers. Safely conducting a traffic stop, interacting with motorists, issuing a warning or citation, or making an arrest involves the integration of several overlapping domains of knowledge and skill. Traditional police training teaches this knowledge and these skills in a “siloe” environment that lacks context.

The current curriculum requires the completion of a simplified traffic information; however, more than 96% of tickets issued by police in 2024 were completed using a computerized program not used in most academies due to a lack of resources. A 2024 survey of municipal police academy directors in New York revealed more than half sought to further contextualize their traffic stop training but lacked the equipment necessary to do so.
