Chris,

I reviewed the cover letter. I think writing/expression seems mild/soft compared with the notification submitted to NHTSA by other manufacturers when they conducted a safety improvement campaign forced by NHTSA, but this looks fine to me.

EA# is incorrect. It's "EA07-010", not EA07-017. So I corrected.

Toyota and Lexus Original Equipment All Weather Floor Mat

I think it's better to say "Toyota and Lexus Optional Equipment All Weather Floor Mat." Actually AWFM is an optional accessory mat as mentioned in the DIR. In terms of the description of "Original Equipment (OE)" in the regulation (Part 573), this AWFM looks like OE because it's put in the vehicle at the port or dealer before delivery. But also customers can buy it over the counter at the dealer. So I think we should not call it "Original Equipment".

"Safety recall" or "Safety campaign"

The first sentence of the cover letter says "a voluntary safety recall". However, when you reviewed the DIR, you changed "a voluntary safety recall campaign" to "a voluntary safety camgaign". Erika deleted the first sentence of your draft (In accordance with the requirement.....Part 573", so we do not need to say "safety recall", I think.

AWFM

In the second paragraph, all words of AWFM begins with a small letter, but in the DIR, we use a capital letter, like All Weather Floor Mat. So I'm not sure which is better, but I changed to a capital letter.

Let me know what you think before submitting the DIR to NHTSA. I will be waiting for your reply.
