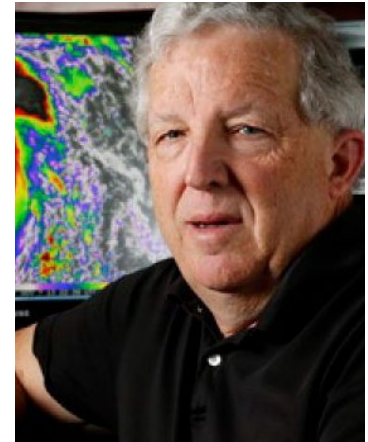




Jan Null, CCM

Jan Null has been a meteorologist for over four decades and is frequently seen on television and heard on the radio when weather is in the news. Twenty-two years ago, Null founded a consulting firm, Golden Gate Weather Services, after a 24-year career with the National Weather Service. He has been an Adjunct Professor of Meteorology at San Francisco and San Jose State Universities since 1987.

After the death of a child left in a vehicle in San Jose in 2001, Null did a comprehensive study of vehicle temperatures that was published in *Pediatrics* in 2005. Since that time, he has tracked cases and continued his research into Pediatric Vehicular Heatstroke (PVH). This information, and much more, is publicly available at NoHeatstroke.org. Null has spoken at numerous national conferences and worked with child safety advocacy groups and agencies to raise awareness about the dozens of children who die from heatstroke in hot vehicles each year.
