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SEAT BELT USE AT RECORD HIGH, BUT NOT AT NIGHT

WASHINGTON – U.S. Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood today launched the U.S. Department of Transportation's 2013 "Click It or Ticket" seat belt enforcement mobilization effort and reminded motorists about the severe risks of driving unbelted, day or night.



Data from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) shows that while nationwide seat belt use was at a record high of 86 percent in 2012, seat belt use at night continues to be lower than during the day.

"We've made great strides in getting people to buckle up since the first seat belt campaign was launched in 1985, but we still have work to do," said Secretary LaHood. "The 'Click it or Ticket' program builds on those earlier efforts – sharing the message that seat belts save lives."

According to NHTSA, the risk of being involved in a serious crash is greater at night than during the day. In 2011, 62 percent of motorists who died in a crash that occurred at night were unrestrained, compared to 43 percent of those who died in a crash during the day. During the Memorial Day weekend, law enforcement will focus on both day and night time drivers for seat belt use. Read more...

SEAT BELT CAMPAIGN STARTS MONDAY

FULTON – Mississippi law enforcement officers begin a campaign to increase seat belt use Monday.



The Mississippi Click It or Ticket campaign is an annual event from Tuesday to June 2 that aims to drive traffic accident fatalities down by increasing the number of people wearing seat belts in motor vehicles.

"It's not about writing tickets as much as it is about changing behavior and getting people to start wearing seat belts so we can keep our people alive," said Office of Highway Safety Liaison and Sherman Police Chief Joel Spellins at the campaign's annual kickoff lunch in Fulton. "Seat belt usage has increased and our death rate is going down every year because of that."

The MS Office of Highway Safety reported 71.3 percent of Mississippians surveyed reported wearing seat belts in 2008 and that number went up by 10 percent by 2011. Read more...


MORE COPS ON THE ROAD FOR HOLIDAY TRAFFIC SAFETY CAMPAIGNS

Lake County, OH - A number of departments in Lake County are joining the "Click It or Ticket" and the "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" campaign for the upcoming Memorial Day weekend and the weeks leading up to the holiday.

Vernon Hills Police Department will have extra police officers on the street through May 27 to watch for people driving in an unsafe way and to look for drivers and passengers, especially children, who are not secured with seat belts. The department reminds drivers that since Jan. 1, 2012, Illinois law requires all passengers, regardless of age or location in the vehicle, to be secured in a seat belt or an appropriately approved child restraint system.

If a passenger has a disability or medical condition that makes him/her unable to secure his/her own safety belt, the driver is responsible for securing and adjusting the safety belt for that passenger. Read more...



They will be pushed to the NHTSA Facebook and Twitter audiences, to the thousands of bloggers who subscribe to our e-Blasts, to the SaferCar mobile app, to state and local traffic safety experts, to traditional media and to partners.

May's highlighted the "Click It or Ticket" campaign where High-visibility enforcement is credited with increasing the national seat belt usage rate from 58 percent in 1994 to an estimated observed usage rate of 86 percent in 2012 - an all-time high rate.

June's edition of **Safety 1n Num3ers** will feature **Pedestrians** with a 4-page layout newsletter, data and safety facts.

Every issue of the 4-page newsletter will focus on a different safety topic and will be a weekly product with two presentation versions. At least one offering a month will be a 4-page newsletter dedicated to a major topic. The next version will be data points tightly focused on any of the many safety topics NHTSA oversees.

Things to remember when walking:

- ✓ Always walk on the sidewalk facing traffic. Walk on the sidewalk if there is one. If there is no sidewalk and you have to walk on the road, walk facing traffic.
- ✓ *Cross streets at corners or in crosswalks*. Cross where pedestrians are expected. Follow pedestrian signs and signals, always watching for traffic to ensure you are seen.
- ✓ Be safe. Be seen. Brightly colored clothing makes it easier for drivers to see you during the daytime. At night, use a flashlight or wear reflective material on your shoes, cap and jacket or on your arms or legs that bounce the car's lights off you and back to the driver. This light cautions the driver that there's something or someone moving and they should slow down and be careful.

WASHINGTON – The U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) today announced a new iOS app for iPhones and iPod Touches that will provide real-time vehicle safety information to consumers from NHTSA's SaferCar.gov site. NHTSA's SaferCar app allows users to search its 5-Star Safety Ratings for vehicles by make and model, locate car seat installation help, file a vehicle safety complaint, find recall information and subscribe to automatic notices about vehicle recalls.

NHTSA will also give developers real-time access to the data that powers this app through an Application Programming Interface (API), enabling them to integrate these data into new and existing apps and empowering consumers with important safety information. Millions of consumers already rely on these data to inform their purchasing decisions on popular automobile review sites; now they'll be able to access these data in real-time. Read more...

RUTLAND, VT - May is Global Youth Traffic Safety Month, a time when the National Organization for Youth Safety (NOYS), and its 70 national nonprofit organizations, works with youth groups to engage in traffic safety projects in their local communities. LAW OFFICIALS HOST TRAFFIC SAFETY FAIR



Spaulding Park, IL - Distracted driving is something that happens every single day, whether it's your first time getting behind the wheel or you've been driving for years. Area law enforcement officials are reminding the public just how dangerous distracted driving can be.

Sending or receiving a text message while driving takes your eyes off the road for an average of 4.6 seconds, which state officials, say is equivalent to driving 55 mph the entire length of a football field-blindfolded.

"It's kind of an eye-opener," Spaulding police officer Jeff Balding said. "People don't realize--they think that they are a lot better at texting and driving than they really are."
